The Tillotson Fund's Empower Coös Youth Grants Program gives high school students the opportunity to help strengthen their communities, support local nonprofit organizations, deepen their connection to place and develop leadership skills.

At the core of the program is a grantmaking committee comprised of area high school students. Committee members serve for up to two years and are responsible for making grant recommendations on applications submitted to the Empower Coös Youth Grants Program.

Established by committee members in 2018, the priorities for the Empower Coös Youth Grants Program are to:

- Support environmental initiatives and programs that focus on reducing carbon emissions through education and awareness-building or through direct carbon-reduction practices.
- Increase extracurricular activities for youth (ages 12 to 22) such as: programs and activities that build community, enhance environmental education awareness, or increase access to science, music, arts, and athletics.
- Strengthen community engagement through events and public gatherings that enhance connection and togetherness.
