Grant awards were made to the following organizations:

Appalachian Mountain Club, Boston, MA received \$150,000 (over two years) to continue providing sustained, place-based, outdoor academic and youth development programming for youth, 4th through 12th grade.

Berlin & Coös County Historical Society, Berlin, NH received \$20,000 to complete the rehabilitation of the Maynesboro Stud Barn.

Bethlehem Redevelopment Association, Bethlehem, NH received \$50,000 (over two years) to support operations.

Bethlehem Trails Association, Bethlehem, NH received \$10,000 to continue designing and building a mountain bike skills park.
