59 grants totaling \$2,129,616 March, June, September 2021

Grant awards were made to the following organizations:

Adaptive Sports Partners of the North Country, Franconia, NH received \$20,000 to increase sports and recreation programming for people with disabilities of Coos County.

**Appalachian Mountain Club, Boston, MA** received \$150,000 (over two years) to continue providing sustained, place-based, outdoor academic and youth development programming for youth, 4th through 12th grade.

Berlin & Coös County Historical Society, Berlin, NH received \$20,000 to complete the rehabilitation of the Maynesboro Stud Barn.
